Plan Your Program

You should plan for approximately 2 - 2 1/4 hours at the Center for the best visit possible. This will vary depending on the age of the students and the program being given. Of course, we can be flexible with your timing needs.

Here is a typical agenda for your visit:

Arrival and Welcome: 5-10 minutes

Program: 1 to 1 1/2 hours, depending.

Gift Shop/Museum Visit: 20-30 minutes

Departure: 5 minutes



Booking Your Visit

To reserve your program time, please call the Museum at **(260) 356-6356**. We also have a **booking calendar online** at our website, www.historyeducates.org, from which you can check available dates or book your tour. We ask that reservations be made at least one week in advance to receive a guided program. We encourage one adult for every 10 students if possible.

A helpful tip is to book early for your program. Time slots will go quickly, especially for fall.

Affordable Quality

Your field trip is **\$2.50 per student per program during your visit to the Museum.**

Special pricing is available for "The Constitution Rules" program for groups over 200. See back for Outreach Programming pricing. We recommend one program per visit, but can accommodate two consecutive programs.

Exhibit Galleries

The Exhibit Galleries have been completely reworked in 2010. Can you imagine reading a genuine newspaper from 1789 which talks about Vice President Adams? Your students will see artifacts from all 47 vice presidents in history!

Gift Shop

If you are able to visit, the Center has a gift shop of affordably priced souvenirs for your students. Many items are less than \$2.00.

All sales in the gift shop help subsidize the cost of presenting educational

programming, thus providing a benefit to schools. Items match themes of the educational programs that are presented.

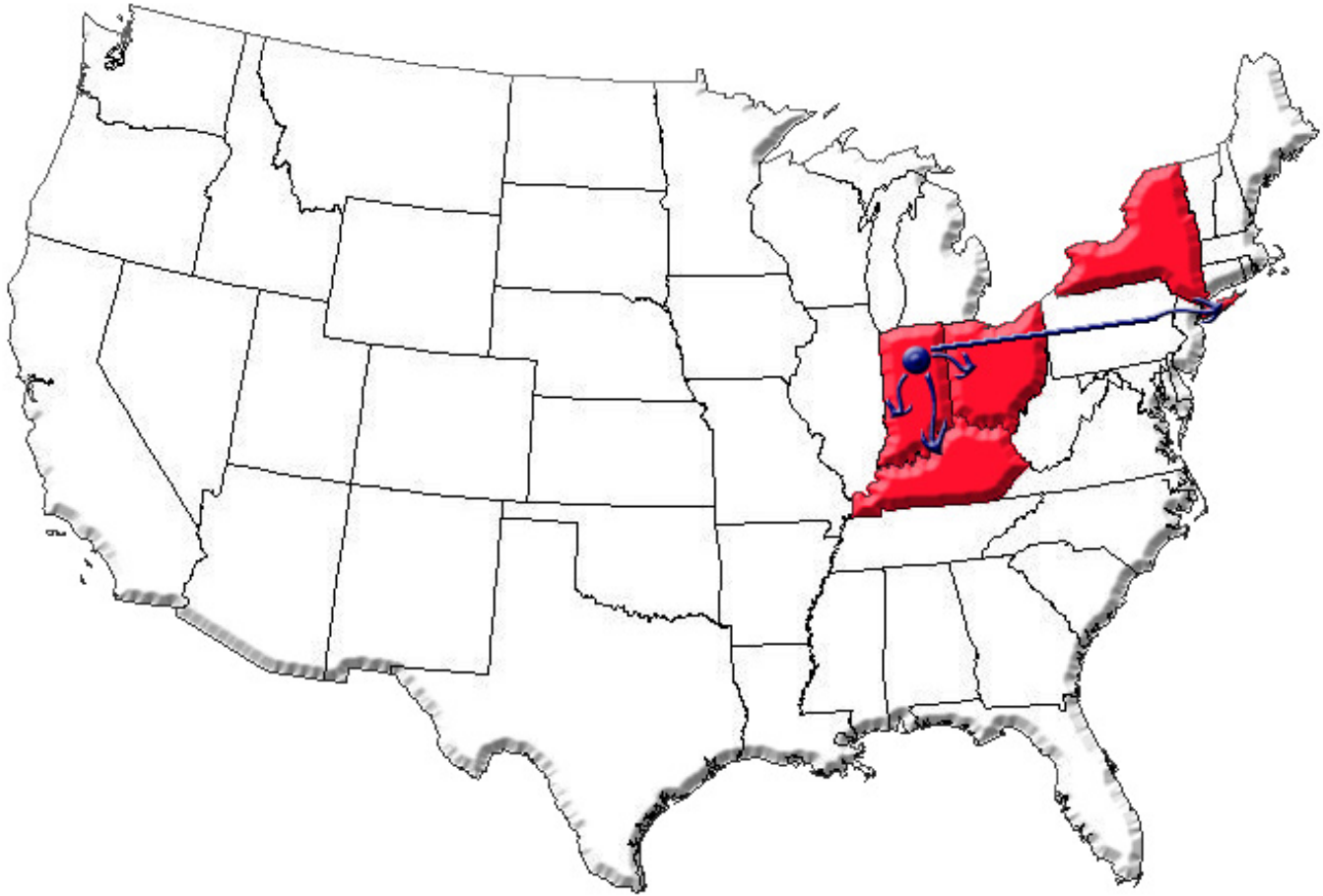


Tips For Teachers

A great way to maximize your field trip day is to combine a tour of our facility with a trip to another site in Huntington, such as the Historic Forks of the Wabash at (260) 356-1903, the Sheets Wildlife Museum, (260) 356-9453, the Huntington County Historical Society, (260) 356-7264 or the New Huntington Theatre (260) 224-3248. Other ideas include the Huntington County Courthouse, the Sunken Gardens or one of the reservoirs. Ask us, we'll create the optimum field trip day for you!

Educational Outreach

Bringing The Museum To Your Classroom



Budget Tight? Think You're Too Far Away? We'll Come To Your School!

Gas prices are running very high. School budgets have been tightened further and further. If you are not able to bring your class to us, let us bring the Vice Presidents to your class. All of our programs are available to be presented at your school. Depending on the program, appropriate visual materials and artifacts will be brought to give your students the best possible experience.

Worried that you may be too far away, even to bring our programs to your school? Ask us! You'd be surprised how flexible we are! The Museum's programs have been presented in schools throughout Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio and even New York. If your students are willing to learn, we're willing to come to you!

Outreach Fees: The cost for outreach is **\$3.00 per student per program**, with a minimum fee of \$100, plus mileage. Additional fees required if an overnight stay is necessary. For groups with 200 to 500 students, there is a discounted pricing option. It is \$450.00 flat fee for the first 100 students, plus \$1.25 per each additional student. Mileage, plus overnight fees (if necessary) also apply. For groups over 500 students, please call for pricing.

An excellent way to save even further is to combine outreach visits among multiple schools. We have served many schools this way.
